PRODUCT INTRODUCTION

The **WM111** is a Draft IEEE802.11n-compatible half miniCard module in a 2x2 configuration and operating in the 2.4GHz band. This module allows an embedded host to use its PCI-E base 1.1 compatible interface to connect to a Draft IEEE802.11n compatible access point at unprecedented speeds.

Due to Ant. A and Ant. B are the same type antennas, only the higher gain antenna "Ant. A" was tested and recorded in this report.

For IEEE 802.11b/g mode:


Only Ant. A-1 can be used as transmitting antenna.

Both Ant. A-1 and Ant. A-2 can be used as receiving antennas.

For IEEE 802.11n mode:

Both Ant. A-1 and Ant. A-2 can be used as transmitting/receiving antennas.

Ant. A-1 and Ant. A-2 will transmit/receive the same signal simultaneously.





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FCC Statement

End Product Labeling

This transmitter module is authorized only for use in device where the antenna may be installed such that 20 cm may be maintained between the antenna and users. The final end product must be labeled in a visible area with the following: "Contains FCC ID: N89-WM111

The OEM integrator has to be aware not to provide information to the end user regarding how to install or remove this RF module in the user's manual of the end product which integrates this module.

The end user manual shall include all required regulatory information/warning as show in this manual.

Industry Canada Statement

This device complies with RSS-210 of the Industry Canada Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions:

1) this device may not cause interference and

 this device must accept any interference, including interference that may cause undesired operation of the device

This device has been designed to operate with an antenna having a maximum gain of 5dBi.

Antenna having a higher gain is strictly prohibited per regulations of Industry Canada. The required antenna impedance is 50 ohms.

To reduce potential radio interference to other users, the antenna type and its gain should be so chosen that the EIRP is not more than required for successful communication.
