Note: The WET610N has disable the 5600-5650M band by S/W to avoid 5600-5650M band for IC certification.

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

1 Installation

A. Insert the Setup Wizard CD into your CD-ROM drive.

You must enter the PIN number into your router. Refer to your router's user guide for details. When finished, click **Next** to continue.





3 Manual Configuration

A. On the Available Wireless Networks screen, the available networks are listed in the table. Select your network, and then click **Connect**.

Passphrase The Passphrase is case-sensitive and must have 16 or fewer alphanumeric characters.


